The MCC emblem consists of two central flames surrounded by the outer edges of the globe. Many in the MCC denomination consider this emblem to symbolize the Holy Spirit's presence in our diverse world.

'Illumination' is a six-foot high wall sculpture that was fabricated with steel to form the sections of the flame and globe. A stainless steel mosaic design covers the painted steel back-plates and fits together like a puzzle, each piece with its own unique shape.

'Illumination' is not only an inspirational work of art; the individually attached stainless steel pieces serve as distinct nameplates suitable for engraving.

Donors can choose to have engraved text as a memorial, honorarium or commemoration of people or events, either through giving one-time financial gifts, increasing tithing pledges, or through exemplary church attendance.

Just like each of us, who are unique individuals in so many ways, each piece of the mosaic is different – yet they all fit together as one.
